

# MOORPARK HIGH SCHOOL Battle of the Bands 2023 / 2A Prelims General Information for Spectators



### When

Saturday, November 11. Gates open at 11 a.m. Performances scheduled 11:45 a.m. to 10 p.m.

#### What

The Battle of the Bands is a field show competition featuring several thousand performers from dozens of marching band & color guard programs from across Southern California. This, the 27<sup>th</sup> BOTB, also serves as the 2A Prelims for the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association in advance of the SCSBOA championships, November 18<sup>th</sup>. It is also an important fundraiser, with all net proceeds supporting the Moorpark High School Instrumental Music Program, through our all-volunteer nonprofit booster association. We appreciate your support!

### Where

Moorpark High School is located at 4500 Tierra Rejada Road in Moorpark, CA 93021.

## Directions

From the 101 Freeway, take the 23 into Moorpark, exit Tierra Rejada Road, and head west (left). From the 118 Freeway, continue onto the 23 to the Tierra Rejada exit, and turn west (right). Follow Tierra Rejada just over 3 miles, and turn right onto Countrywood Drive, towards Arroyo Vista. (Performers & equipment will go 2.75 miles, turning right onto Mountain Trail, for band check-in.)

### Parking

<u>There is **no spectator parking on campus**</u>. Campus parking is *extremely* limited and *entirely* allocated to 175 vehicles carrying 1750 performers, 250 directors & judges, & mountains of instruments and equipment. <u>Only pre-registered band vehicles will be allowed in campus parking</u>. *After 1:30*, spectator parking at the end of Countrywood (following from above) offer a short walk to convenient field-level admission at our Pit entrance. <u>The city locks the gates to these lots at 10pm</u>. There is additional parking in two neighborhoods: off Countrywood west of campus (left off Tierra Rejada, away from AVCC), as well as on Willow Spring Drive and its offshoots, southeast of campus. Parking is also available at and behind the stores (Vons, etc.) across the street from the high school. For vehicles with valid handicapped placards, reserved handicapped parking is available at the top of the stadium, accessed via the Mountain Trail Entrance Gate. Inquire with volunteers at that gate.

### Admission

Admission is \$15 for adults, \$10 for students & seniors, at any of 3 booths. Children under 5 are free.

### Seating

Spectators will view the tournament from the home side. Performers will view from the visitor side.

### Programs & Concessions

Virtual programs will be online, through a QR code and URL TBD. Shirts, hoodies, beanies and buttons will be available on site. Walk-thru and Grab'n'Go food options will be available near the main gymnasium, as well as from several food trucks (inc. Mister Softee and Frontier Kettle Korn).

### Restrooms

In addition to constructed restrooms, portable toilets are strategically distributed around campus.

### Lost and Found

Lost and found is located at Command Central (on the campus map, find the red star near the center.)

### First Aid

**In an emergency, dial 911.** A First Aid tent is located behind the home-side seating, between the "I" building and the Auxiliary Gym.
